• Welcome/Introductions (All Present)

• Principal Update: Matt Britten

Veteran's day ceremony in on 11/8 from 9:30 to 10:30 AM. We have over 50 military families at Frederiksen. All active military members and veterans are invited. Nov 1 Mr. Britten attended PBIS & MTSS training for cultural and student mental health awareness. State wide test CASP results are back. Fred students scored 2-3% more than the previous years in English and Math. We have seen an increase of 30% in science scores. We brought in a new science teacher Mrs. Bloom and that helped increase our numbers.

• DUSD Trustee: Kristin Speck

Trustees are elected by area. Ms. Speck has been elected from Area 2 of West Dublin.

Fred Enrollment

684 students are enrolled at Fred. 4 elementary schools in Dublin (Fred, Murray, Green and Kolb) have enrollment in 600s and other 3 have enrollemnt in 800s. The capacity of Fred is 914 students. We may see 600 kids enrolled at Fred in 5-6 years. Housing has gone up in the last couple of years. 6th grade is the largest class in DUSD with 1025 students. Second largest being 8th grade with 1007 students followed by 5th and 7th grade in upper 900s. Wells has enrollment of 1060 students and has a capacity of 1126. Wells will be at capacity next year.

Shamrock Hills New TK-8

Shamrock hills open next year as TK-5 or TK-6 to begin with and will go upto TK to 8. Wells students will have the option to enroll at Shamrock hills once it opens. There has been a proposal to make all elementary school TK-6. Parents voted against it in a survey conducted.

Bond Funds and Future District Projects

Bond money has to be used for facilities. Murray is getting MPR, cottonwood is getting a gym.Most of the gyms do not have air conditioning, that is being taken care of by these bond funds.. Wells is redoing their track. Wells is also getting a new MPR and drama room. Dublin high track will be renovated. We have 55 million in state matching funds. The new housing community near safeway is paying 19 million to DUSD. We have earned 6 million in interests on bond money. This may be used to pay 3 years of solar panel loans.

Budget Shortfall

We have a deficit of 5.5 million. 85% of our budget is spent on people. People cuts may happen to compensate for this deficit.
